Motorists

- When overtaking cyclists give plenty room – as much as you would a small car
- Don't overtake cyclists in the face of on-coming traffic
- Slow down near mounted horses, walkers, joggers – give plenty of room
- Be patient if delayed by other road users
- Ensure you can stop in the distance you can see is clear, particularly on bends

Show respect to other road users – acknowledge courtesies

Cyclists

- Wear light-coloured or reflective clothing and a helmet
- Use the cyclists gathering point
- Keep groups to under 4 and pull in regularly to allow passing
- Descend hills slowly particularly when wet and check your brakes before descent
- Look well ahead to spot changes in road surface, drains, etc...
- Pull in when safe and convenient to avoid tailbacks.
- Indicate clearly if changing direction
- Avoid ferry traffic if possible
- Ensure your bicycle is in good working order with lights and reflectors
- Show respect to other road users acknowledge courtesies

Walkers/Joggers

- Wear light-coloured or reflective clothing
- Position yourself where you can be seen by oncoming traffic
